Dear Father Murphy:

Mayor Koch has asked me to thank you for your support and indicate to you the City's intention to minimize, to the extent possible, the effects on the community of the city jail on Flushing Avenue.

As you undoubtedly know, after you wrote the Mayor the Federal Government signaled its approval of the City's plan and the Board of Estimate has approved it as well. We are thankful for their support and the support of community leaders like yourself because we recognize the concern that communities feel about detention facilities. We must however, respond to the realities of our time, which unfortunately include a jail population that has grown by nearly 50% over the last five years. Our best projections indicate that it will continue to grow through 1988. The plan the Mayor announced on December 9th, and approved by the Board of Estimate on December 30th, is designed to insure that the City will have adequate space to safely house all prisoners remanded to our custody.

The City has substantial experience operating detention facilities, with four borough houses of detention in addition to five seperate facilities on Rikers Island. As a result, we recognize the concerns you expressed about visiting, recreation and security. Although my comments must be contrained by the fact that we have only just begun design of the facilitiy renovations, I can assure you that all of your concerns will be considered in the design and operation of the jail. For example, there will be adequate space, as there is in all of our jails, for visitor waiting facilities inside the jail. All loading and unloading of prisoners will be within the secure perimeter of the jail. And, all necessary security measures will be taken, including sophisticated security hardware, cameras and sufficent staffing to ensure the safety of the community, as well as the guards and inmates.
